PE and Sports Premium Grant 2015/16

At Cheddar First School and across the Mendip Edge Federation we believe PE and Sport plays an important role in the development of all our learners with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the announcement by the government that a new grant for PE and School Sport would be given to all primary schools from September 2013. The amount awarded is £8,000 for every school plus a premium of £5.00/pupil.

Aims:

The overall aim of our work is to increase the children's participation in high quality PE and games and to introduce them to a wide range of different sporting activities.

To continue to provide opportunities for children to participate intra and inter- school sporting events, extending the opportunities for intra school activities.

To promote sporting activities and positive behaviour through lunchtime sporting activities.

To broaden children's awareness of the opportunities for sport.

To extend the amount of extra-curricular sporting provision.

To provide CPD for staff so that initiatives can be sustained beyond the two years' funding.

To provide sporting activities for hard to reach pupils.
